Warning: Generosity Will Change You

Passage: Luke 12:13-21, Luke 12:31-34, Acts 20:25, Proverbs 21:26

Before The Meeting

- Take time to read Luke 12:13-21, Luke 12:31-34, and Acts 20:25. Reflect on your personal approach to money, possessions, and generosity. Pray for your group members, asking God to open hearts and inspire a spirit of giving that reflects His kingdom.
- **Watch or Attend the Message**: Listen to Pastor Mark Ragsdale's message at <u>churchatviera.com/live</u>.

Leader Prep

- Consider how generosity (or lack of it) has shaped your walk with Jesus.
- Be ready to share a personal story of a time generosity changed your heart.
- Be mindful that finances can be a sensitive topic—create an environment of grace, not guilt.

Icebreaker

- What's the best gift you've ever received? What made it so meaningful?
- Have you ever given something away that meant a lot to you? What was that experience like?

Beginning the Conversation

Jesus warns us that greed is a danger to our souls, and He challenges us to rethink our priorities when it comes to wealth. In Luke 12:13-21, Jesus tells a parable about a rich man who stored up wealth but ignored God. Instead of seeking temporary riches, Jesus calls us to seek treasures that last forever.

Today, we'll explore:

- The warning against greed and selfishness
- The difference between financial foolishness and wisdom
- The freedom and joy that comes from generosity

Key Terms

- **Greed** An intense desire for material gain, often at the expense of others or our spiritual health.
- Rich Toward God Living with a heart that prioritizes eternal investments over earthly ones.
- Kingdom Wealth True riches found in serving God and others, not in accumulating possessions.
- Go-Getter & Go-Giver A mindset that pursues both hard work and generosity.
- **Treasure in Heaven** Eternal rewards that come from living for Christ and giving to others.

Discussion Questions – Bible Study

1. The Danger of Greed (Luke 12:13-15)

"Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in the abundance of possessions."

- Why do you think Jesus warns so strongly against greed?
- In what ways can greed be subtle in our lives?
- How does our culture encourage us to define success by wealth and possessions?
- How can we shift our mindset to view life as more than what we own?

2. Financial Foolishness vs. Financial Wisdom (Luke 12:16-21)

"You fool! This very night your life will be demanded from you. Then who will get what you have prepared for yourself?"

- What mistakes did the rich man in Jesus' parable make?
- How does focusing on "me" instead of "we" make us spiritually unhealthy?
- What are some practical ways we can use wealth as a tool rather than an idol?
- How can we cultivate contentment in a world that constantly tells us to want more?

3. The Call to Generosity (Luke 12:31-34, Acts 20:25, Proverbs 21:26)

"Seek His kingdom, and these things will be given to you as well... Sell your possessions and give to the poor."

- What does it mean to be rich toward God?
- Why does generosity require faith and trust in God?
- How does giving reflect the heart of Jesus?
- Have you ever experienced joy from giving? Share a personal story.

Reasons to Live Generously:

- To trust God more than money
- To reflect the heart of Jesus
- To invest in eternal treasures
- To experience freedom from materialism
