

WALKING WISELY WEEKEND 2021

Frequently Asked Questions

What food will be provided by CAV?

CAV will provide Friday night dinner, Saturday breakfast (if student is staying in Host Home), Saturday lunch, and Saturday dinner.

How does transportation work?

If staying in a host home: After a student arrives on Friday evening, students will be chauffeured around up until Saturday night at 11pm when they are dismissed.

If student is not staying in host home: Students will be responsible for arriving to CAV on Friday evening, going home on Friday night, arriving again to CAV on Saturday morning, and going home on Saturday night.

Where will all of the students and leaders sleep?

This year families can opt in or opt out of the Host Home experience.

If a student opts in to the Host Home experience, a “small group” of students will sleep in a Host Home, accompanied by their small group leaders. While beds, couches, and futons may be available, students should be prepared to sleep on floors and bring sleeping bags and pillows.

If a student opts out of the Host Home experience, then that student would sleep at their own home, in their own bed.

Are parents allowed to come to Church at Viera on Friday or Saturday night for sessions?

Yes, we would love to have you! You're invited to either session. There will be an area reserved for hosts, parents, and drivers.

Can my high school student help with transportation?

High school students, including high school leaders, are not allowed to drive during Walking Wisely (even if they are 19). College students may drive.

However, if staying in host homes, high school students would be allowed to drive themselves to registration on Friday evening and also home on Saturday night.

If the student is not staying in host homes, high school students would be allowed to drive themselves to registration on Friday evening, home on Friday night, back to CAV on Saturday morning, and back home on Saturday night.

Where will students be picked up on Saturday?

Students will be picked up at Church at Viera (main entrance) at 11pm.

Who do I contact in an emergency?

In case of an emergency, parent communication should happen through small group leaders.

How will parents be contacted in case of an emergency?

Someone on staff or a small group leader will call the phone number you provided us when you registered your student.

Will there be a medical professional and security at W3?

Yes. We will have a nurse and security present during the main sessions. If your student is on medication, there will be a form to fill out at check-in.

How do I find out where my student will be during the weekend?

Your student's group will be assigned a host home (if you opt in) by the church before Walking Wisely. At that point, you can contact the small group leader for specific details.

What if my student has a food allergy?

Please indicate this in your student's registration.

What if my student needs to be picked up early for a sporting event?

First, make sure your small group leader is aware of your plans. There will be a "time away" form to fill out at check-in.

What does the registration fee include?

Cost includes shirt, small group supplies, dinner (Friday and Saturday), lunch (Saturday) 3 sessions (music and speaker), 3 small group discussions, service project, and small group outing.

When does registration end?

Early bird registration ends on January 19, 2021. Regular registration ends February 8, 2021.

Is there anything required for students to complete in addition to the online registration?

Yes, a consent/ liability release is required to be signed and notarized by parents in order for their child to attend. The church receptionist a notary. Church office hours are 8:30am- 4:30pm Mon-Thurs. If you can't make it in during those hours, contact Cheri Campbell at cheri.campbell@churchatviera.com to make other arrangements.

Additional waivers may be needed dependent on what activity your child's small group plans on Saturday afternoon.
